Teach through a text approach

The **teach through text** approach is the backbone of all the Literacy tree planning sequences and each aspect is reinforced through the other components.

Thematic Links

Links are made through themes and conventions within significant literature

Engaging starting point

Dramatic conventions provide resonance and create a hook with the book.

Embedded Comprehension

Reading Comprehension explicitly embedded through prediction and inference.

Embedded Grammar

Explicit grammar skills for writing taught in context to be applied purposefully.

Purpose & Audience

Distinct shorter and longer writing opportunities rather than genre-led

Literacy Language

Literacy language explicitly taught and applied in writing.

Spelling & Vocabulary

Explicit spelling skills are explored and linked to vocabulary acquisition.
